

Fish Stocking Rates

Stocking the recommended sizes and numbers of fish is very important for good fishing. Fingerlings 1-3 inches long are recommended for new and renovated ponds. Stocking larger fish is tempting but can lead to an unbalanced pond population. Stocking larger fish can also be very expensive. The table to the right suggests how many fish of each species to stock depending on the desired combination. Occasional stocking of larger fishes, or periodic restocking of channel catfish, may be necessary in ponds with established fish populations. The recommended stocking rate for Amurs is 10-12 per acre, and the stocking rate for Koi is 15-20 per acre. **For pick up:** Bring a container (ex: bucket) with plastic liner (ex: trash bag) filled 1/4 full with pond water. 50-100 small fish will fit in a bucket; 2-3 kois or amurs will fit in a bucket.
